

# Annexure II Report of Analysis of Students Feedback

The college has constituted Separate Feedback Committee which collects the student's feedback about teaching-learning process, and infrastructural facilities every year. This committee further analysis the students feedback and the report of which is submitted to principal through IQAC. Then, student's feedback regarding a particular teacher or department is shared with respective teacher or head of the department in their departmental meeting. Students feedback regarding infrastructural facilities is used while developing new infrastructure or providing services in student friendly ways.

During the academic year 2013-14, student's feedback was collect and analyzed. The participant students were randomly selected (N = 400 students).

#### Student's feedback about teacher teaching:

Most of the student had appreciated the efforts made by the teachers. More than 95% students (95.14%) reported that the teachers teaching methodology and approach towards students is highly satisfactory and very low percentage students (4.86%) were less satisfied with teachers teaching. Majority of student reported that teachers were punctual, responsible, morally strong, have good knowledge of their subject, delivers the lectures with prior preparation, they encourage students to ask doubts, pay attention to every students seating in the class, and they do provide after class support even if require out of college.

Some students have given few suggestions for some teaching faculty which includes pay more attention towards the understanding of the subject matter taught to students in the class, they should extent their help even out of the class and they should provide more information about the recent development in their subject.

#### Student's feedback about Infrastructural Facilities:

Feedback is based on randomly selected 60 students. Majority of students (82%) reported satisfaction regarding infrastructural facilities made available to them. Some of the suggestion received from them were listed below -

- (a) Office: Students should get information and guidance related to office services in proper way.
- (b) Library: Students demanded that more number of periodical and newspapers should be made available in the reading room and suggested change in library timing.
- (c) Gymnasium: Students suggested that more numbers sport material and guidance should be made available for them.
- (d) Basic infrastructural facility: Satisfied.

The report of the evaluation and recommedation was submitted to the college and sanstha.

The IQAC has conducted the academic audit of each staff and the department. The separate performa was prepared in which the records of each staff and the department were mentioned and evaluated by the committee of IQAC members. The feedback was provided to staff and department in their departmental meetings by the principal.

#### 5. Evidence of Success:

Following the recommendation of RQMS peer team each department has establish Student counselling and Career guidance cell through which they are counselled for the their problems and guided regarding the specific subject related career opportunities. Considering the financial limits of the college the departments were encourgared to establish edepartmental library and those who already had this e-departmental library were encouraged to strengthen it. It was planned to start new short term course by each department for the students to provide them additional knowledge and skills.

**1. Title of the Practice:** Free Compueter Literarcy Programme for members of 'Mahila Bachat Gat'

# 2. Objectives:

- 1. To orient the rural women to the functioning of computer and its uses in gathering knowledge and relating with others.
- 2. To boost the confidence of rural women.
- 3. To empower rural women by providing them skills of using computer and internet as a tool of earning money.

#### 3. Need Added and the Context

In rural area women are not enocuraged to go outside their home and farm even when it can help her to gain new knowledge and develop new skills which in long run can help the family to earn more money. They are not encourage to continue their study or develop thei skills even when they are capable either due to orthodox values of the family or financial problems. This affects their self-image, self-esteem and self-confidence. Thus, it become neccessory to empower them by providing them additional skills particularly the application of computer which they can use to earn additional income for the family by doing typing and data entry jobs at home.

#### 4. The Practice:

The members of women development cell and computer literacy committee had visited various bachat gats from Pachwad and nearby villages to indentify the interested women. The meeting was organized in the college between college staff and probable participants where the purpose of the activity and how it wil be implimented was communicated to them. Participants doubts were clarified and expectations were considered while designing the syallbus and identifying the suitable time for this activities. Thirty women had shown their interest to participate in this activity

Trainer was appointed to provide training on basic computer application to the participants. This training included the orientation to the parts (CPU, Monitor, Keyboard, mouce) and functions of computer (paints, MS-Office, MS-power point, internet). This training was provided to them daily for one hour and continued for one month.

- Boost in their self-image, self-esteem and self-confidence as reported by the participants.
- Women became capble of using computer and internet.
